1.1.1 The institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process Response: The college is affiliated to Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University, Patan. The college follows the curriculum designed by the university, at university level, there is a board of studies (BOS) which prepares the syllabus. We have 3 members who have served or have been serving as members of BOS. They have/ had contributed in forming syllabus of semester system which is called 'Choice Based Credit System' (C.B.C.S.) - IQAC holds meeting at the beginning of the academic year and discusses academic plan of the year. - List of subjects displays on the notice board so that new students can choose the subject accordingly. - The college

offers 3 main subjects; Gujarati, Sanskrit, History. Defence study is offered as subsidiary subject. English is offered as compulsory subject. - Prospectus is distributed to new students. - Academic calendar is prepared in tune with the university academic calendar. It includes Curricular, Co- Curricular and Extra-Curricular activities of the year. - 'Sapta-dhara' (Seven-steps), N.C.C., N.S.S., Sports and Internal Examination of the college all these are planned at the beginning of the academic year. - Time- Table is prepared, distributed to every faculty and department, it is also displayed on the notice board. - Work load is distributed among faculty members. - Academic diary is prepared for the effective implementation of the curriculum. - Orientation programme is organized for the freshers to make them aware about curricular, co-curricular, extra-curricular activities, examination pattern of semester system....etc - Assignment and project work is introduced, so that participation of the students are involved. - Various departments invite experts and arrange lectures of related subjects. - ICT : the faculty make use of projectors, computer lab, CDs, DVDs, according to requirement. - Remedial classes are arranged for slow learners. - Feedback: the institution takes feedback from the students regarding curriculum and also about quality of teaching of faculty. - The college website is also up-dated with programmes and new syllabus. - Infrastructure Facility: The college has 2 ICT enabled class rooms and a computer lab As an advance learning resources. - The college organized 'Competative Examination Coaching' , 'Co-operative Training Programme', 'Computer Training Programme' etc... <p>1.1 Students Feedback on Syllabus Most of the students are satisfied with present syllabus of semester at undergraduate level. Almost 76 students feel that the course has relevance to impart educational values. They are satisfied with the contents of the course for learning purpose.76 of students are satisfied with relevance of material. 73 of students welcome revision of course. Students suggest about various certificate training programmes at college level like Computer skills, karate, Competitive examination coaching. Etc. 95 of Students opted for selection of main subject at B.A. level on their interest base. 5 of students selected main subject on thinking that they find easy to pass graduation on the subject.80 of the students are satisfied with the library service. 20 of the students feel that Library services should be improved. 90 of the last year students feel that internal evaluation system is desirable. 40 of the students found it very good, 45 of students found it good and 15 of the students found it medium about internal evaluation system.</p> <p>1.2 Student Feedback on Teachers. The college offers three main subjects at B.A level, Gujarati, Sanskrit and History. English subject is compulsory for B.A. programme. Defence Study subject is offered as C.E. (Subsidiary) Subject. Students' Feedback on teachers is taken. 86 of the students are satisfied with the knowledge base of the teachers. 71 of the students find communication skills of the teachers are very convincing and effective during teaching - learning process. The teachers are successful to generate interest of the students in their subjects. 74 of the students believe that the teachers happily welcome students for personal guidance after class-room work. The students suggested for some teachers to inculcate teaching-learning with</p>

various examples.. The Principal discussed this topic with related teachers and convinced them to do it in the most positive way. All teachers got more than 84 rating on overall impression from the students. 1.3 Students suggestions: After analysis of students' feedback, following suggestions comes out -To start sports games like football and cricket. -To start college canteen in the campus. -To make a shaded parking stand. -library service is felicitated with internet service. The institution looks forward to fulfill the suggestions in near future. 2. Teachers Feedback: . On Students: All Students are well disciplined, and no issue of ragging or gender harassment. Results of the 80 students are over all good but lack of general knowledge and lack of computer skills Majority of the students are from interior and rural background, with majority strength of SC/ST/OBC. 52 of students actively participating in co-curricular, extracurricular, Sports and also NCC, NSS activities. A few students issue reference books from the library. College Infrastructure: Sufficient classrooms. Well maintained garden. Big campus and ground area. More financial assistance required for overall development. 3. Employers Feedback: -The Principal and the all staff works well tuned with vision and mission. -Faculty performs academically excellent in terms of Teaching-Learning. -Results are appreciable. -Infrastructure requires more development.

(maximum 500 words) At the beginning of an academic year Principal held meeting with all faculty members and allots students as per semester and roll number. Student strength of college was 836. Each mentor has 76 mentees, and mentor mentees ratio is 1:76. Mentor's duty is to take care of students. To provide mentoring as per requirements of the students. Mentor provides all sorts of suggestions, information and guidance to students for overall developments. Mentor provide solutions to the problems of the students. Mentor make him aware about educational matters, scholarship benefits, various activities of the college. Sometimes students come with even personal problems. Mentor advises the student and try to solve it. When students are having problem in their subject mentor solves the problem. Subjects mentor encourages their mentee for the higher study. Our college provides co-educations. Almost 50 of students are girls. Many girl students from village are coming for under graduate programme. During under graduation marriage takes place. After marriage girl students cannot continue study. Mentor convince their in-laws family and then they can continue graduation. For boys , after completion of under graduation they wish to join higher studies. Sometime parents do not allow them for that due to social and economical conditions. At that time mentor convince their parents for the higher study. Mentor suggests making use of library books,reference books to improve knowledge. Mentor provides all sorts of information such as exam time table activities, university events and celebration etc. Gujarat Government has provided tablet to all students for better study. Mentor gives demonstration and help to use their tablet for study. Students use e content through the help of tablet. Students are guided for maximum use of library. Students are constantly evaluated by their mentor and counseled for improvement. Weak students are given proper suggestions. Bright students are encouraged for improvement and awarded in annual function.

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2.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

The institution tries to maintain quality and also tries to enhance qualitative output regarding teaching - learning and evaluation process. The college is

affiliated to Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University, Patan. - University implemented semester system at UG and PG level with Choice Based Credit system(CBCS) and college follows the same pattern. - The college implements internal weekly tests, assignments, project work, internal examination...etc. - Examination Committee is formed which arranges examination and make necessary reforms. - Orientation programme is held to make aware about examination pattern and internal tests of the college. - The details of evaluation are communicated to the students. - Monthly test contains of 10 marks, internal examination contains 40 marks which is divided by 2 for internal marks. 10 marks contains weightage from assignments, project work, seminar...etc. - So 2010 30 internal marks pattern is implemented. - Marks of each and every test is displayed on notice board. - Computerized marksheets are prepared of each semester and displayed on notice board. - University examination contains of 70 marks. - College internal marks is uploaded to university on line - The examination committee finds out strong areas and weak areas of the students and arranges orientation as per requirement. - Last three years university papers are solved in the class room. - During examination, there are only two students per bench system is arranged. - Every class room is equipped with surveillance of CCTV, so any kind of mis-conduct is recorded. - College tries to retain copy free atmosphere during examinations. - Faculty members themselves check internal examination papers. - University arranges central assessment system in which faculty members go to university center for assessment and evaluation of papers. - Marksheets are prepared subject wise and class wise, including internal marks. - Demand for re-assessment is forwarded to university in prescribed format. - At college level, application is taken from the student and the examination committee solves the issue transparently.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

The college is affiliated to HNG University, Patan. The University prepares academic calendar at the beginning of an academic year. It contains academic days, examination days, vacation days etc. - College prepares college academic calendar in tune with university academic calendar. - At the beginning of an academic year meeting is held among the principal, IQAC Co-Ordinator and the faculty members for the yearly planning. - Meeting is held with clear vision mission and qualitative progress of the students and the faculty members. - Suggestions are welcomed and then two senior faculty members prepare academic calendar of the college. - It contains academic days of choice based credit system of semester pattern. It also contains Curricular, co-Curricular, Extra-Curricular, N.C.C., N.S.S., Sports and 'Saptadhara' activities. - Internal college examination days are mentioned and then university exam days are also mentioned. - Vacation days are also mentioned. - College examination contains 40 marks which is divided by 2 for 20 internal marks. - 10 internal marks are from assignment, seminar work, project work. So it is 20 10 30 internal marks system. - University holds 70 marks examination of each subject. So 70 30 100 marks. - Assessment and internal Marksheets prepared by the faculty members objectively. - CCTV surveillance ensures transparent and copy free ambience in the college. - Various activities like cultural, sports, social services, N.C.C., N.S.S. are divided month wise round the year. Various committees formed and work accordingly. - Seven committees are formed called ' Sapta-dhara' for cultural and co-curricular activities. - Academic calendar is planned and implemented for conduct of CIE in the college.

7.2 – Best Practices

7.2.1 – Describe at least two institutional best practices

1. BASIC COMPUTER TRAINING PROGRAMME Objective: - Our college is situated in rural-remote area of Sabarkantha district. The district is also declared as backward district. Majority of the students come from rural-remote villages and also from economically backward class of society. - Knowledge of computer is inevitable and necessary for college students. College runs B.A. programmes, in

which computer subjects not included. College has DELL laboratory, with 25 computer set. Reference: - College runs basic computer course, programme for college students for one month. Village students and SCSTOBCGENERAL students get benefit to learn computer skills. Government also demands employees who have passed 'ccc' Computer course. So, college provide platform for computer learning. Challenges: - Students, who completed school education and take admission to college, have not studied computer education training school education. Rural students initially not ready for such extra courses. Besides B.A. programme, students have no computer is English, so initially it is a little challenging for ARTS students. Planning: - Computer Basic Training programme, is planned, recourse person is hired from HI-TECH COMPUTER. He teaches daily two hours to students. Faculty members, who are aware, of such skills also take lectures. Practice time and reading material is also provided to the students. Almost one student per computer ratio is maintained. - Such students are allowed in computer laboratory for practice during free lectures. They are also allowed round the year in the computer laboratory. Limitation: - College has only one computer laboratory with 24 computer sets. So limited students get benefits of this course. Recourse faculty is also very limited due to rural set up. English language is also barrier for college students. Rural students have limited bus facility, so they cannot stay for more practice in college after 12 pm. Benefits: - College runs free of cost ' Computer Basic Training Programme ' for one month for college students. So those students pass 'ccc' examination easily, which is minimum criteria to get government job. Some students get private job due to computer skill. Some run computer classes or serve as instructor. Due to computer skills, many students get benefit in their job opportunity and for promotion also. 2) Free Coaching for Competitive Examination. Objective: - College is situated in backward district Sabarkantha. Most of the students come from rural, remote and backward areas. Majority of the students are from economically backward section. Majority of the students are consisting of SCSTOBC cast. Girl students are almost 45 to 50 in the college. Reference: - Such students cannot attend privet costly coaching classes for competitive examination. So college runs one-month coaching programme for comparative examinations for free of cost. Teachers of college and others invited to provide coaching to the students. Challenge: - Students come from rural and remote areas. They returned to home by bus. So it is difficult for some students to stay beyond time schedule of bus. - Girl students also face same problems. Planning: - College provide coaching for one month in following subjects like Guajarati, literature, English grammar, history, geography, mathematics, general knowledge, computer...etc. after college lectures, extra 2 hours provided for such coaching. The college organized coaching from 19/07/2018 to 19/08/2018. Time table was prepared and subjects were allocated to the facultymembers.140 students participated in the coaching camp. Everyday two lectures are arranged of two subjects. Weekly test is also arranged to test their knowledge. At the end of course examination is arranged. Passing students receive certificates also. Limitations: - Our college has only arts faculty, with three main subjects Gujarati, History, Sanskrit. College teachers are available for such subjects. But for subjects like computer, mathematics, science, college has no faculty. College tries to invite recourse persons from other institutes. ResultsBenefits: - Students get awareness about various competitive examinations. - Coaching is free of cost, so poor students can also get benefit. - Some of the students pass such competitive examinations and get job as Teachers, Police constable, S.R.P, Indian army and others department of the government. - This coaching programme is open for not only our college students but also for surrounding area students. So, it has a kind of social attachment also, some students in various departments of government. Facing problems: - College cannot hire resource persons who demand more money. Some rural students left coaching classes in the middle of the courses due to less frequency of buses to their route.

Weekly Test Scheme Majority of our college students are from rural and interior areas. The surrounding areas population is educationally, socially and economically backward. The students also work in the field or doing labor work for their livelihood. They don't have healthy educational environment at home. The institution started weekly test before two years. Objective: The aim of this test is to inspire and encourage the students for regular educational work in every subject. The institution monitors their progress from the result of weekly tests in every subject. Challenge: In the beginning we experienced less interest of students in these weekly tests but constant inspiration and guidance of teachers made the more students positive for weekly tests and number of students increased and participating enthusiastically by the time. Planning: We take weekly test Semester wise in each subject. After evaluation of these papers, the mark-sheets are displayed on the notice board. The weak students are given necessary suggestions and personal guidance by the teachers. The teachers take extra lectures. The intelligent students motivated by the teachers to read more reference books from the library. The students are provided necessary practice material also. Limitations: Many of our college students are from rural and interior areas. The surrounding areas population is educationally, socially and economically backward. The students also work in the field or doing labor work for their livelihood. They don't have healthy educational environment at home. Due to economic and social responsibilities, they remain absent in the weekly test. Results/Benefits: The institution and the students experienced positive performance and educational progress in the two internal examinations at college level. These tests help students to build their confidence as well as educational quality. The students perform very excellent at university examinations. Our college results are higher than average results of university and the nearby institutions. Almost 24 students achieved distinction marks and 70 students achieved First class percentage at Semester 6. The pass out percentage of B.A is 89.14. The pass out result of M.A. at University examination was 100 23 students achieved Distinction marks and 04 students achieved First class at M.A. University examination. The students need not pay any extra fee for these weekly tests. The institution bears expenses for this best practice. The institution provides necessary stationary like answer sheets for the tests to the students.

NSS also recruits volunteers, arranged orientation and round the year arranges social service-based activities, one-day camp, seven -day camp also. Sports teacher orients the students, make list of students according to each game and provide coaching on the ground during practice. To organize seminar in Gujarati subject. Weekly test method is arranged round the year subject wise time table is prepared, displayed, and followed. Welcome day, Teachers day, Yoga-day, national festivals, cleanliness drive, Thalassemia test, Annual day, Blood donation etc. programmes are well planned and celebrated during the year. Scholarly lecturers are invited to deliver lectures. class room seminars, projects are also planned and implemented. President and the principle make suggestion for better quality output in various academic and co- academic activities. Feedback is taken from the students, teachers and the employer. Improvements are done according to suggestions. Faculty members are encouraged to take part in seminars, workshops, to write research articles. Faculty is always eager to make qualitative improvement in all aspects of academic, co-academic and other educational aspects.
